We're starting We've Got You in Birmingham. The City Council is supporting our programme and we are working with St Basils, and Birmingham Children's Trust to identify the young people who we could support.

We want to focus on really helping a few young people in the first year. This way, we can really grasp what each young person needs.

We will identify young people who could be helped through We've Got You

We've formed a Universal Family with St Basils and Birmingham Children's Trust and we welcome other likeminded employers to join us

Together, we will assess their needs and what we could support with

Our ambition is to roll out We've Got You to other local areas where we have new projects in the pipeline. We will work with the local council, housing associations and partners in these areas to get their support and to find young people who could benefit from We've Got You.

We want to ensure that young people who are care experienced or facing homelessness can access additional support. We understand they face extra barriers to finding a job and a home, and this is why we've set this fund up.

The fund is available to young people aged 16 to 25. This fund will be managed by St Basils, and applications will come from We've Got You partners.

How will it help?

- Provide items a young person would need to gain and maintain employment.
- Remove barriers preventing them from gaining employment.
- Support young people if circumstances mean that they may lose their employment.
- Help them to find and keep accommodation enabling them to work.

Those eligible to apply include:

- Anyone who has recently left the care system.
- Anyone who has been in the care system at any point in their lives.
- Anyone currently at risk of homelessness or who has been homeless.
- Those currently actively seeking employment opportunities.

A key part of their work is the Care Leaver Covenant, a national programme which launched in 2018 that supports care leavers aged 16 to 25 to live independently. Through their work with a range of partners they seek to provide meaningful opportunities for care leavers. "Building skills and finding meaningful work are crucial elements in a young person's journey to independent adulthood. However, these things are difficult to achieve without stable, safe and secure housing.
